The title contains the first three words that open the song VI of Hell of the Divine Comedy of Dante Alighieri. This book was originally to be released in May, but the death of its author precipitated its exit. La Nave di Teseo which publishes this information on its Facebook page, is a new publishing company born from the desire of many prestigious authors, including Umberto Eco and Sandro Veronesi (Quiet Chaos), to protect their independence and editorial diversity, after the birth of a publishing giant in Italy. On October 5, the family of the former prime minister and billionaire Silvio Berlusconi, owner of Arnoldi Mondadori Editore, announced it has purchased RCS Libri, RCS pounds subsidiary, editor of Corriere della Sera.
